## Wristbands

Your weekend wristband pass is issued to individuals and is NOT transferable. Please wear it AT ALL TIMES for the duration of the festival in order to gain access to the venues. While we make every effort to size the venues to accommodate anticipated demand, unfortunately, we cannot guarantee admission into specific venues once the fire limit is reached. You will be able to enter the festival site with your wristband. You will not be able to enter venues or get served at the bar without having your wristband.

## Stewards

Stewards are at the festival to help everyone, please follow their instructions. Everyone who helps with the Festival is a volunteer, so please give them your support.

## Traffic control

**The site speed limit is a maximum of 5 mph.** We operate a **one-way traffic system** for the weekend, please drive carefully and follow direction signs. Vehicles CANNOT be parked anywhere other than at your camping pitch or in the designated parking areas (marked P on plan). All vehicle parking is provided at your own risk and the festival organisers accept no liability for loss or damage to your vehicle.

The centre of town is only a short distance away and most of the events are on the festival fields so please leave your vehicle parked up. In the event of inclement weather all vehicle movements back onto the Festival site will be stopped.

## Camping

**CAMP SITE OPEN AT 4.00 p.m. THURSDAY** - No entry before that time.

**Limited hard standing for large Motor Homes bookable in advance for a supplement.**

Camping is available to weekend pass holders with the appropriate camping pass only. Please camp sensibly leaving reasonable space between you and your neighbours and ensure the roadways are not blocked to emergency vehicles.

**CAUTION:** There is river with a steep bank at the western (nearest town) boundary of the site, be careful when manoeuvring caravans in this area. There is also a deep ditch by the bridge into the main camping fields; parents are advised to keep a close eye on children near these hazards.

## Caravans

Caravans must be parked at 90° to roadways (not parallel to them) and with a car's width between adjacent caravans.

AS A PRECAUTIONARY MEASURE IN CASE OF FIRE PLEASE KEEP A SUITABLE CONTAINER OF WATER OUTSIDE YOUR TENT OR CARAVAN. Please familiarise yourself with the position of fire points. OPEN FIRES ARE NOT PERMITTED neither is the setting off of FIREWORKS or inflammable Chinese lanterns during the Festival.



## Dogs

Dogs are welcome on site at the Festival but they are not allowed in any venues to comply with the local Authority Health and Safety regulations. The exemption for Guide dogs applies where owners are asked to sit near to an aisle for safety reasons. The usual responsibility of cleaning up after your dogs and keeping them under control at all times applies.

## Car Parking Areas

Are available opposite the site for day ticket/event holders or overflow.

## Other information

**Please remember all festival venues are non-smoking areas.**

On arrival you will be presented with a bag for your rubbish; please deposit it in the skip by either gate on your departure and remember to use the rubbish bins provided around the hospitality area.

Showers are available at the Football Club free of charge.

The site must be vacated by 12 noon on Monday unless you are stewarding and part of the clear-up crew.
